The hermeneutic tradition (sometimes just called "hermeneutics") is a tradition that gives great philosophical weight to an interpretative mode of understanding. Members of this tradition include Friedrich Schleiermacher (1768-1834), Wilhelm Dilthey (1833-1911) and, after Heidegger, Hans-Georg Gadamer (1900-2002) and Paul Ricoeur .
